What job could training lead to?

Successful completion of this qualification, will assist the participant to gain active employment as a dogger in the construction industry

Am I eligible?

Participant's must be 18+ years old

What will I receive?

After training and a successful assessment trainees will be given a Statement of Attainment by OHSA and will receive a National Licence from the Department of Industrial Relations Queensland. D.G. (Dogger).

Can I go on to further training?

Further studies are offered in basic, intermediate and advanced rigging licences. Depending on your desired outcomes, OHSA Training offers a wide range of training pathways that may suit you.

Literacy, Numeracy and Assessment

Adequate numeracy, literacy and English communication skills to do simple calculations, write legibly and be understood. Sufficient physical strength and dexterity to attach slings, etc, direct and place loads and have good vision and hearing. If you believe you need assistance to complete these tasks, it is suggested that you speak to our staff who will arrange an interview for you with one of our Learning Support Teaching staff prior to commencing your study program.

Materials / Other Requirements:

OHSA will provide each public course trainee with a safety helmet, gloves, high visibility vest, safety glasses, a clipboard and training materials. Trainees are required to provide their own steel capped safety boots, long sleeve shirt and trousers. The informal learning record (logbook) for high risk occupations can be used by the trainee and supervisor to record the informal training and operational experience obtained in the workplace.
