OVERVIEW

The General Construction Induction White card training provides new and existing workers with the basic understanding and knowledge needed to start or continue work within the building and construction industry.

This card was formerly known as a blue card.

To hold a general construction induction card you must show knowledge of:

- Occupational health and safety legislative requirements
- The basic principles of risk management and injury and illness prevention in the construction industry.

You will need to complete training and assessment to be issued a general construction induction card (white card).

Upon successful completion of the course, the RTO will issue evidence in the form of a Statement of Attainment that you have completed the training and the white card will be issued. You should keep evidence of completion of training as it may be required to replace your card in the future.

STANDARD 11 SURFACE MINING INDUCTION

The Standard 11 (S11) Mining Induction (correctly known as the Generic OHS Induction from Appendix 3 in the Qld Department of Natural Resources and Mines 'Recognised Standard 11 – Training in Coal Mines) is a required course for new starters to work on a mine in Queensland. NOTE: If you intend to work on a BMA Coal Mine in Queensland you should check first with site about their mining induction requirements prior to enrolling into this course.

OHSA are one of the largest and most regular providers of this course. This course exceeds the requirements of most other interstate mining induction requirements (however you should always check first with the mine about any specific requirements they may have).

MINING SUPERVISOR (\$123)

This course is the mandatory course for supervisors in the mining industry. It meets the requirements for the position of a Supervisor in the Resources Industry as per s.56 of the Coal Mining Safety and Health Act 1999 and s.51 of the Mining and Quarrying Safety and Health Act 1999 and are recognised by both Coal Mining Safety and Health Advisory Committee and the Mining Safety and Health Advisory Committee.

We also offer a 5 day worker's package which includes Standard 11, Work at Heights, Confined Spaces and Senior First Aid over 5 consecutive days from Monday to Friday or Wednesday to Sunday weekly. Supervisors can choose to do the 5 day supervisor's package which includes the Standard 11, Mining Supervisor S123 and G2 over 5 consecutive days Monday to Friday or Wednesday to Sunday.

G2 RISK FACILITATOR

This 'G2' RIIRIS402E Carry out the Risk Management Processes course covers the skills and knowledge required to Carry out the Risk Management Processes in the Coal and Metalliferous mining industries. This competency is a statutory requirement according to mining legislation for certain occupational categories as deemed by the respective Mining Safety & Health Advisory Committees. Some mining companies have expanded which groups of people require this competency with some sites now requiring any person with a supervisory capacity to also hold this competency along with the Mining Supervisor S123.

This unit of competence supersedes the MNCG1002B – Implement and apply Risk Management Processes; commonly referred to as G2.

ONLINE WORKPLACE REHABILITATION & RETURN TO WORK CO-ORD. COURSE

This course is a combination of online and a phone chat/video conferencing with the course assessor.

This course is designed to provide an introduction to the management of injured workers in Queensland according to the Workers' Compensation and Rehabilitation Act 2003 QLD & Regulation 2014 OLD.

It is the responsibility of the employer to ensure their Rehabilitation and Return to Work Coordinator is appropriately qualified and competent to carry out their role as per S.226 of the Act. It is also the responsibility of the RRTWC that they understand the principles of managing injured workers with reference to the legislation and best practice injury management principles and is able to fulfill the Functions of a RRTWC as per Reg 114 of the Regulation.

ICAM LEAD INVESTIGATOR TRAINING COURSE

The ICAM Incident Investigation method is quickly becoming the preferred method for investigating incidents on many major projects and is being identified as a required skill for WHS personnel.

The OHSA ICAM Incident Investigation Lead Investigator Course has been developed around the Incident Cause Analysis Method which has been developed in association with Professor James T Reason in his research on Human Error and its contribution to incidents.

HEALTH & SAFETY REPRESENTATIVE HSR

The HSR training course provides participants with the skills and knowledge to enable them to fulfill the role of Health and Safety Representatives (HSR) as set down in the NEW National Harmonisation legislation as detailed in section 72 of the Work Health and Safety Act 2011 and s.21 of the Regulation 2011. OHSA is licensed to deliver this government approved course. HSR's are then entitled to receive 1 day refresher training every 3 years. We can also deliver in-house courses on-site.
